- Economic Opportunity



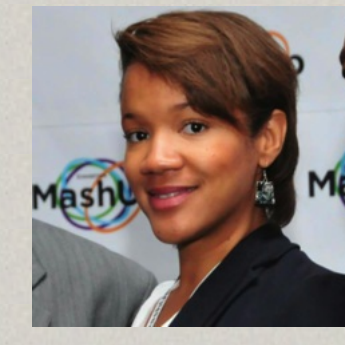

Would you like to be able to accurately track your energy usage so you know when it's too high and you're wasting money? Right now Commonwealth Edison is installing smart meters throughout Evanston to provide you access to more information about your electricity usage through personalized, online energy management tools. You can enroll to receive phone or email alerts when your usage is trending higher than normal for your household, and sign up for weekly emails that summarize your daily usage.
