

City Awarded \$100,000 Grant to Enhance Migratory Bird Habitat

The City of Evanston has been awarded a \$100,000 grant by the Chi-Cal Rivers Fund to create and enhance migratory bird habitat along the North Shore Channel in the Ladd Arboretum and four nearby Evanston parks areas that provide critical support for tens of thousands of birds that pass through the region annually. Enhancements will focus on:

Upgrades to the Ladd Arboretum's dock area and trail
Refurbishment of wildlife observation decks in Twiggs and Harbert Parks
Addition of an informational kiosk at the beginning of the refurbished trail
Creation of an Evanston Habitat Network stewardship group and Birding Trail website

The City's grant application was supported by CGE and several other organizations: Openlands, Evanston Environmental Association (EEA), Citizens' Greener Evanston (CGE), the Bird Conservation Network and Patricia Frank, Judy Pollock Consulting, LLC, Living Habitats, and the Evanston TreeKeepers.


Explore the Great Lakes Through Cartography And Photography
