Edible Evanston was selected as one of the "Ten Ideas for the Future" as part of the Evanston150 Celebration. We encourage residents to attend their upcoming seed swap and learning event on [March 12 at the Evanston Ecology Center](#) (2024 McCormick Blvd.). Starting at 2:30 p.m. you can select from hundreds of packets of free vegetable, fruit (and some flower) seeds to help you grow more of your own produce, and you can also share your extra seeds with local gardeners. In conjunction with Natural Habitat Evanston, Edible Evanston is encouraging those who saved seed from native plants to bring them to share with others as part of the effort to encourage pollinator habitats throughout Evanston.

From 4:00-5:30 p.m. the group will hold a free presentation, panel discussion, and Q&A session on preventing diseases and pests in your garden and organic solutions to common problems.
