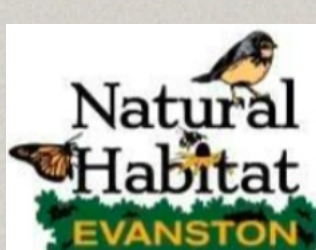


**Electricity Aggregation – It Matters**

Evanston today produces 20% fewer emissions than we did in 2005. Much of this reduction comes from one initiative, Electricity Aggregation. In addition to reducing our contribution to climate change, aggregation has saved the average Evanston household a small amount of money compared to ComEd since its inception in 2012. It has been a win-win for households and for the planet. Residents can opt out of the program, but fully two thirds of Evanston residents participate in the program.

On June 28th, the Evanston City Council will vote on the next Electricity Aggregation contract. We don't know yet whether 100% green power will cost more or less than ComEd. But we do know that only 100% green power can keep Evanston on its track to reducing greenhouse gas emissions.
