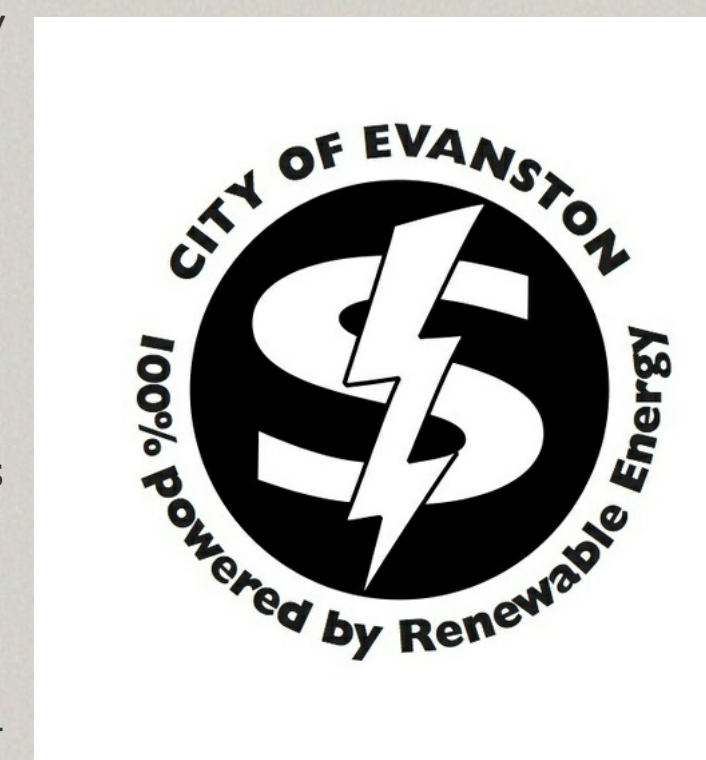




Electricity Aggregation is up for Renewal

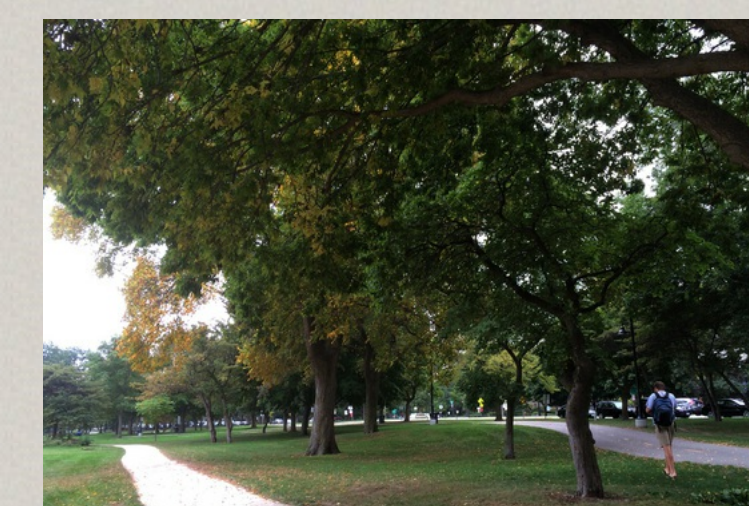
Evanston Earth Day is April 22nd

Chicago is participating in The People's Climate March - April 29



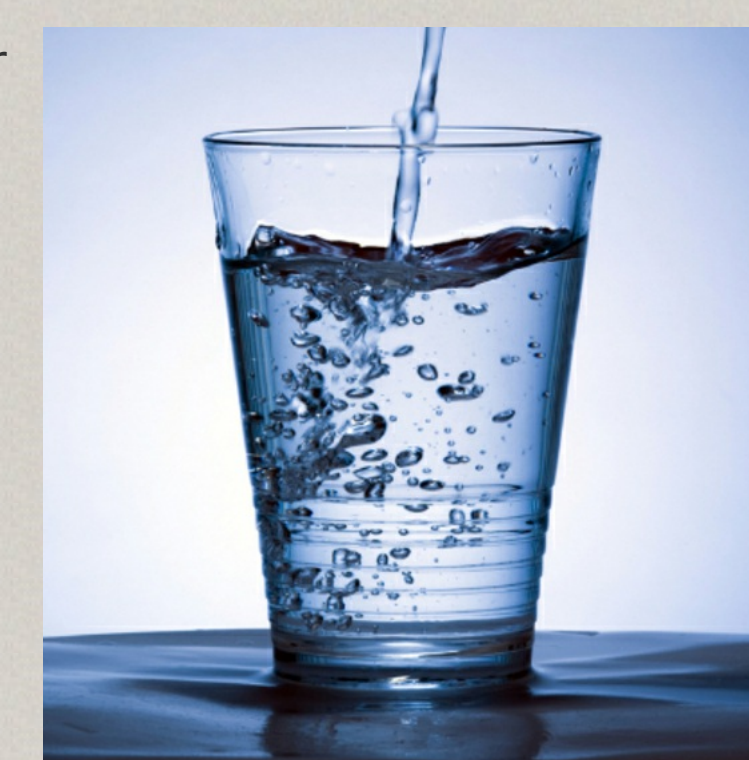
