Evanston Launches New Composting Services

Last month Evanston became home to the largest municipal food composting program in Illinois. The program includes two new food waste composting options that will make it easier for Evanston residents to compost food waste and will move the City toward achieving its sustainability goals.



The City has expanded its weekly yard waste collection to allow food waste to be included among the standard grass

clippings and leaves. Food and yard waste is collected on a weekly basis from residential and condo properties from April through December. The food and yard waste cart comes with an initial one-time purchase fee of \$82.50 and then a \$25 annual fee. Acceptable items for these bins include vegetables, fruit, and meat, among many others.

In addition, the City has partnered with Collective Resource, Inc., an Evanston-based and woman-owned business, to provide year-round food waste collection service to any interested property in Evanston, including businesses and commercial properties.
