#### **Evanston Achieves National Wildlife Federation Certification!**

As the effects of climate change are felt it is increasingly important that we create spaces for native wildlife, including birds and pollinators, to thrive. So it's a major achievement that Evanston has done just this citywide and been recognized by the <u>National Wildlife Federation</u> (<u>NWF</u>) for doing so. It is the first Illinois city to achieve this milestone.

To achieve certification, the City had to do two things: (1) educate and provide outreach about how to create healthy, sustainable habitat for pollinators and birds through scores of activities, such as hosting spring and autumn festivals, forging partnerships, arranging plant giveaways and sales, restoring natural areas, securing grant funding, creating demonstration gardens and more; and (2) have about 200 gardens certified as habitat by the NWF. In May and June, <u>Environmental Justice Evanston (EJE)</u> presented the draft of an Environmental Justice resolution to Aldermen Revelle, Rue Simmons, and Braithwaite, as well as to the Evanston Environment Board (EEB), Kumar Jensen (the city's Chief Sustainability and Resiliency Officer), CGE, and the Equity & Empowerment Commission to solicit feedback and gain support for the ordinance. EJE has documented input offered and is working to update the ordinance draft. More meetings with potential stakeholders are being scheduled for the near future.

EJE has been actively involved with and supports the six-month City of Evanston Air Quality Monitoring Study that kicked off on May 2 at a meeting at the Gibbs-Morrison Cultural Center. The initiative will gather data on air pollution, noise and truck traffic around the Church St. Waste Transfer station.
