It's a Critical Time for the Clean Energy Jobs Act

Now is the time to let Governor Pritzker and the Illinois legislature know how critical it is that they support the <u>Clean Energy Jobs Act (CEJA)</u>. The Act is comprehensive clean energy legislation (Senate Bill 2132/House Bill 3624) proposed in the Illinois General Assembly that would boost energy efficiency, take advantage of the falling cost of wind and solar power, and secure savings for consumers while significantly ramping up renewable energy development in the state. Not surprisingly, the fossil fuel industry is fighting it. So what can you do?

Progress on the City's Environmental Justice Resolution

An Environmental Justice Resolution in Evanston will be an historic step toward achieving a more sustainable and equitable future for all Evanston residents. To help drive this effort forward, members of Environmental Justice Evanston (EJE) and Kumar Jensen, the City's Sustainability Coordinator, recently presented in support of a resolution to both the Environment Board and the Equity & Empowerment Commission. Both groups responded positively.

The next step is a joint meeting of the Board and Commission on Thursday, February 20, at 6:30 p.m.. when the EJ resolution will be reviewed in detail. Please come out and support the resolution by attending the meeting, which is being held in the Civic Center's Parasol Room (4th floor). If the resolution gets the go-ahead that evening, it will go to the City's Planning & Development Committee and then to the full City Council for approval.
