Financing Options

Purchase The homeowner purchases the system in its entirety up front and realizes all the energy savings and tax credits.

Finance The homeowner arranges a loan for some or all of the installation from the solar panel installer. However, the homeowner still realizes the energy savings and tax credits.

Lease The homeowner puts no money up front and arranges a lease term with the solar panel installer. However, the homeowner still realizes the energy savings. In some cases the homeowner may realize the tax credits, in other cases the solar installer does.
