Onward with Aggregation!

The Evanston City Council has approved a 30-month agreement with Chicagobased MC Squared Energy Services, LLC as part of the City's community choice electricity aggregation program. The agreement will support the goals of the <u>Climate Action and Resilience Plan (CARP)</u> by moving the City closer to its goals of 100 percent renewable electricity by 2030 and community carbon neutrality by 2050.
