Environmental Justice Evanston Wins NU Grant to Help Map Inequity

[Environmental Justice Evanston \(EJE\)](#) was recently honored with a highly competitive grant from Northwestern University's [Racial Equity and Community Partnership Program](#) incubator program. The grant supports EJE's partnership with the City to develop a Geographic Information Mapping System (GIS) that identifies areas of environmental inequity, a critical component of EJE's work to eradicate environmental injustices in Evanston. Across the country, [GIS systems have already helped map out](#) redlining areas, historical lynchings, school segregation, and police violence. Noise Pollution, Air Pollution, and Disrupted Wildlife Habitats: All This and More From Gas-Powered Leaf Blowers

Evanston's Climate Action Plan calls for the City to "Phase out the use of gas- and propane-powered leaf blowers" (p. 19). Yet starting to do so has proven difficult, as has enforcement of seasonal restrictions on blowers. As reported in a [recent Evanston Roundtable article](#), the discussion continues to rage on at City forums. Council member Revelle had tabled the discussion in June to allow for input from landscaping companies and residents. Your Input Needed on Church St. and Chicago Ave. Projects

Two major Evanston projects are in the works that will have a major impact on transportation here. Both are still in the first phase and you can still let the City know what you want them to address. The [Chicago Ave. project](#) has among its goals:

- Create a Complete Street for multimodal Transportation including walking and biking
- Improve safety for all users
- Focus on transit access areas for CTA, Metra, Pace, and the Northwestern Shuttle

Among the objectives of [the Church St. project](#): improving pedestrian safety, filling a gap in the bicycle network between Dodge Ave. and the west city limits, and filling the gap in the trail network between Dempster and Church, with the goal of improving safety and mobility for people walking and riding bikes within these corridors.

In both cases you can provide your input via the drop-down menu at the bottom of the respective City pages.
