Evanston Approves Resolution Declaring Climate Emergency

On Monday, April 25, the Evanston City Council unanimously approved a resolution declaring a climate emergency as well as an immediate mobilization effort to restore climate stability. Drafted by the Evanston Environment Board, the resolution calls for the City Council to adopt implementation of the City's Climate Action and Resilience Plan (CARP) as a City Council goal and to regularly review the City's progress, and revising targets to reflect the most recent science, data and best practices. The resolution notably calls for greater accountability of City staff "to ensure that they prioritize decisions and actions that reduce greenhouse gas emissions over those that do not."




Connecting Earth, Moon, and Community - Full Moon Lunar Eclipse Jam
