<u>Participatory budgeting (PB)</u> is a democratic process in which community members decide how to spend part of a public budget. It gives us, Evanston residents, real power over real money. Our Council has set aside roughly \$3 million in federal ARPA funds for the participatory budgeting process. To kick it off, the City will host a <u>Participatory Budgeting Town Hall</u> this Thursday, August 4. During the Town Hall, residents will learn about participatory budgeting and how to be involved in the process. There will also be an opportunity to ask questions.

- The front desk at the <u>Fleetwood-Jourdain Community Center</u> on Tuesdays from 4-6pm or Wednesdays between 8:00 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. Their crew will wash and bundle it to share with families at their popular Free Farmstand 2:30-5:30 on Wednesdays.
- <u>C & W Market and Ice Cream Parlor</u> on Church St. between 4:00 8:00 p.m. on Fridays. The wonderful folks at C & W distribute food to 120 families on Saturday mornings.
