## New Report: Climate Change Could Trigger Toxic Disasters Along Lake Michigan

[A study](#) just released on June 15 by the Chicago-based Environmental Law & Policy Center (EPLC) warns that rising lake levels, strong wind gusts and high waves are inching closer to flooding northern Illinois spots such as Rogers Park, and damaging coal, nuclear and Superfund sites along the lake. It points out that the region's 200+ shoreline communities have already spent \$878 million in the past two years repairing damages from extreme weather events and stresses that "Now is the time to prepare for the risks ahead."
